

JOHN 3:16

John, the son of Zebedee and brother of James, was one of the twelve
and one of Jesus' closest
during his time on earth.

John wrote the gospel of John several decades after Matthew, Mark, and Luke wrote their gospels.

John 3 recounts the well-known, night-time conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus.

There is some scholarly debate about the "voice" of John 3:16-21. Some scholars think Jesus spoke these words, while other scholars think John wrote these words as commentary on the previous story.
