



## MATTHEW 5:21-48

### Introduction

- The Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) was a sermon Jesus preached to his \_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 5:1).
- The Sermon on the Mount has three main aims:
  - It exposes our sin.
  - It drives us to repentance and faith in Jesus.
  - It shows us how to live lives that honor God.

## Anger
